An Empty Tomb?

Easter is the most important holiday we have. It should be our happiest celebration. Remember, Easter commerates the most



important event that ever took place in all of human history. Even Jesus' birth is eclipsed His Resurrection. It is a one of a kind event. Even accounts of resurrection or returning the dead to life—like the raising of Lazarus and of the son of the widow of Nain—return the person to this side of death. Jesus is raised up to the other side of death. Our death is in front of us. Jesus' death is behind him. Paul teaches us this quite clearly. For example, Paul say this in Romans 6:9-10: "We know that Christ, being raised from the dead, will never die again; death no longer has dominion over him. ¹⁰ For the death he died he died to sin, once for all, but the life he lives he lives to God."

Jesus promises to raise up on the other side of death along with Him. As John 11:25 tells us, "²⁵ Jesus said to her [Martha], "I am the resurrection and the life. Whoever believes in me, though he die, yet shall he live, ²⁶ and <u>everyone who</u> lives and believes in me shall never die."

We believe that Jesus now lives on the other side of death. We believe that after the resurrection of the dead we too will live with Him on the other side of death. That is the very heart of our Christian faith.

But it has to be faith. God can do anything. God could have arranged things so that there would be direct and

irrefutable earthly proof that Jesus died and rose from the grave. Instead, God chose to give us this knowledge from the words of others who have gone before us. That is because God chose faith, not our senses, to be the means by which we might know. Again we learn from the apostle Paul about the vital importance of our Christian faith:

"8 Indeed, I count everything as loss because of the surpassing worth of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord. For his sake I have suffered the loss of all things and count them as rubbish, in order that I may gain Christ 9 and be found in him, not having a righteousness of my own that comes from the law, but that which comes through faith in Christ, the righteousness from God that depends on faith—

10 that I may know him and the power of his resurrection, and may share his sufferings, becoming like him in his death, 11 that by any means possible I may attain the resurrection from the dead. (Philippians 3:8-11)

A Full Basket

Everyone likes Easter candy! I know I do. I love jelly beans and white choclate rabbits. I really like the big choclate covered egg. My favorite is fruit and nut or maple, or peanut butter meltaway, or coconut. After the Lenten fast there is a temptation to think that I have earned the Easter candy. I have a right to enjoy it. But joy is not a right. Joy is something you make happen, Joy is a response to somebody or something. It is up to you to decide whether you want to feel joy or not. And it is up to you to find that joy in response to what is really important instead of what is trivial or fleeting.

So as you celebrate this easter, enjoy the candy that is in your easter basket. The sweetness of the candy is a pale reminder of the sweetness of God's gospel promise of everlasting with Jesus, the risen king of all creation. But all that candy is a reminder, not a substitute for the reason we celebrate Easter. Keep in mind the real meaning of Easter. Learn to find your joy in the wonderful news that was first

announced by those who followers of Jesus who saw the Risen Lord first hand. Let us add our voices to the voices of the church throught the ages as we proclaim: JESUS IS RISEN! HE IS RISEN INDEED!

During Lent, Brighton Heights Lutheran Church has been having their INFORMAL SOUP AND BREAD SUPPER. They are held at 6:00 pm prior to Wednesdays Lenten Service.

LENTEN SOUP AND BREAD SUPPER dates: April 5, this is the last of the Wednesday service. SUNDAY, APRIL 9 IS PALM SUNDAY. Palm Sunday is the Sunday before Easter. It is celebrating Jesus' triumphant entry



into the city of Jerusalem at the beginning of Holy Week. Jesus rode a donkey into Jerusalem and the people there laid down their cloaks and small branches of trees in front of him and sang part of Psalm

118:26-26 — Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord. We bless you from the house of the Lord.

The symbolism of the donkey may refer to the Eastern tradition that it is an animal of peace, versus the horse, which is the animal of war. A king would have ridden a horse when he was bent on war and ridden a donkey to symbolize his arrival in peace. Jesus' entry to Jerusalem would have thus symbolized his entry as the Prince of Peace.



THURSDAY, APRIL 13 IS MAUNDY THURSDAY (HOLY THURSDAY). It commemorates the Last Supper of Jesus with the Apostles. <u>BHLC will have service at 7pm.</u>

FRIDAY, APRIL 14 IS GOOD FRIDAY. This is the day Jesus died on the cross for us. There will be service at BHLC at 7pm.



There will also be a GOOD FRIDAY WALKING STATION starting at Brighton Heights Lutheran Church at 12 noon and ending at Risen Lord Church.



SUNDAY APRIL 16TH IS EASTER SUNDAY. We celebrate the resurrection of Jesus from the dead. This occurred on the third day of

his burial after his crucifixion by the Romans at Calvary. Come and celebrate the Jesus' resurrection on <u>Saturday</u>, <u>April 15th at 5pm service or Sunday</u>, <u>April 16 at our 10:30am service</u>.
