









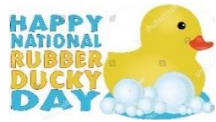


New Years Eve 2019 and Day 2020 - New Years' Day on the other hand, is a time to relax and enjoy the start of a bright and promising new year....a new beginning. Many people make New Year's resolutions, did you? January 6th is the Feast of the Epiphany /Three Kings Day. The Three Wise Men / Three Magi were merchants who saw the star over Bethlehem when Christ was born. They followed the star, to find the Christ child lying in the manger. They brought the Christ child gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh. The word "Epiphany" comes from the Greek word "to reveal". This day is known as "Theophany" - the revelation of God to Man.

National Rubber Duckie Day is January 13th. Rubber Duckies have a very long history. Rubber animal toys, including ducks, first appeared around 1880. Those first toys were made of solid rubber and did not float. Even then, rubber duckies were among the most popular. As World War I and II came, rubber was too expensive, and they were made of plastic or vinyl. Over time, design changes made them hollow so they would float. Then, a small weight was added to the bottom, so it always floated upright. The Rubber Duckie was inducted into the Toy Hall of Fame in 2013.

National Hat Day is January 15th. It's a chance to make a statement or to display you favorite headgear. Many people wear baseball hats to show off their favorite team, helmets are worn for safety protection and hats are also worn to keep our heads warm or to protect us from the sun. Did you know? More body heat is lost from your head than other parts of the body. So, wearing a hat goes a long way towards staying warm on a cold winter's day (or night).



Thesaurus Day is January 18th. Do you know what a Thesaurus is? Thesaurus lists synonyms (words with the same or similar meaning) for words. It allows you to avoid repetition in writing and speeches. It also lists antonyms...words with opposite meaning.
